At the end of the lecture, a short, useful discussion was held on the main issues and messages presented by the professor.

- ❖ The next lecture was given by Geert De Lepeleer, a member of the BIOSINT project from KU Leuven. His lecture was about practical recommendations for teachers from a holistic point of view. Key messages and tips for successful internationalization:
 - A clear definition of the purpose of the internationalization of the curriculum, accompanied by a clear financial business plan
 - A clear pathway towards Internationalisation of the curriculum
 - Involving all stakeholders
 - Improving proficiency in the English Language
 - Creating the ideal conditions for successful student and staff exchanges
 - Internationalize course content
 - Using digital learning tools
 - Promoting the new curriculum and dissemination the examples of good practice
 - Limit the administrative burden but act and teach internationally
 - Listening to students and respect the intercultural differences
